THE 'OTHER' COLLEGE SCANDAL: GRADE **INFLATION HAS** TURNED TRANSCRIPTS INTO MONOPOLY MONEY

 Consider these facts: A 50-plus-year nationwide study of the history of college grading finds that, in the early 1960s, an A grade was awarded in colleges nationwide 15 percent of the time. But today, an A is the most common grade given in college; the percentage of A grades has tripled, to 45 percent nationwide. Seventy-five percent of all grades awarded now are either A's and B's. The National Association of Colleges and Employers reported in 2013 that <u>"66 percent</u> of employers screen candidates by grade point average (GPA)."

### **DEGREE BUYING AND SCANDAL**

 Prosecutors say in late 2001, Cynthia Richard paid \$1,500 to an unnamed Southern official for a fake master's degree in Special Education from Southern University. They say she then sent a fake transcript showing she completed five semesters worth of work to the State Department of Education to get a teaching certificate.
